"A Seed from the Sower"

Growing up in Statesboro, I remember seeing commercials from a man by the name of Michale Guido from Metter, Georgia. All during the day, there would be a short three-minute devotional with birds chirping and an excited older man sitting in the garden ready to tell a story - a story that would be geared to a common theme that would connect his story to a very important biblical principle. I would always watch it and think, "What in the world is this man doing?" Then I would do my best to mimic the birds whistling in the background. Little did I know that this example of God's Word would sink into my heart and begin to grow.

You see, it has been some 35 years later, and as soon as I mention this story, I envision the man and his stories revolving around my head: stories about David facing a giant, God's people walking on dry land, Abraham being faithful and so many more that I could not even count. As funny and awkward as this three-minute commercial seemed, seeds were being planted for what God was preparing to nurture and eventually harvest.

As we walk into this *NEW SEASON* together, I pray that you recognize that God has not only been preparing Wynnton for seeds to be planted, but also preparing your field to be planted as well. I know that you have heard me speak many times that God is capable of using anyone at any time of their life, and I continue to fully believe that now. God has used children, young adults, adults and mature adults to plant seeds that multiply a harvest. God has chosen people who were just as normal as you and I and used them to build His kingdom, destroy walls, defeat giants and even walk on water... for a brief moment.

You see, the Farmer has continuously been attempting to sow the seeds in each and every one of us. The real question that we need to answer is, when is God ready for the seeds to take root and grow? Well, to be honest, that is all based on the condition of the soil. As we see in Jesus' parable of the sower, there are many different types of soil, and we all represent each of those soils in different seasons of our lives - seasons where we have found ourselves at the foot of Jesus and seasons where we have felt so distant that we ultimately believe that God does not care; seasons where we are growing stronger and stronger in our faith, and seasons where we continuously question EVERY step God is walking us through.

As Paul is writing his passionate letter to the people of Galatia and to us, we finally begin to realize that we know that the seeds have taken root in us when we are able to begin telling our story. I know that you may say, "OK, Jason, here we go again," but I do need you to realize that even our sermon series has been leading us all to this point. The story that we share is the fruit that is being revealed through seeds that were sown by the Sower. None of this is happenstance. ALL of this is a way for God to demonstrate to us all that He has been tending our gardens at Wynnton for a long time and He is ready to begin to see the growth and harvest that is ready to be reaped. We just have to faithfully believe and trust that God, the SOWER, has given us such a time as this to grow and flourish for the glory of God.

The Sower has already been and will continue to cast out seeds into the prepared soil and fields. We just need to believe and accept that NOW is OUR TIME for the NEW SEASON to begin producing the fruit God has been nurturing for a long time.


