For many of us, the concept of "joy" can be difficult to define. Christian author C.S. Lewis describes "joy" in his autobiography Surprised by Joy. Lewis explains, "you don't find joy by pursuing it - joy is a byproduct. Joy can come from loving and being loved, and from work that you love, but the greatest and most enduring joy is from knowing God through Jesus Christ and being a part of his joyful kingdom." Composer Elton Roth experienced enduring joy when he stepped into a neighborhood church to escape the sweltering summer heat in Texas. As Roth walked through the quiet empty space, he felt the Holy Spirit and began to sing a melody as he wandered through the aisles of the Sanctuary. The music he sang would become one of the first hymns he ever composed, "In My Heart There Rings a Melody." This joy-filled hymn embodies the joy of knowing God through Jesus Christ.
