"Power of Presence & Listening"

August 25, 2024

Growing up, I was always told that I have two ears and one mouth for a reason. Basically, I am to step back and take the time to listen before I say anything in response. To be honest, that is very difficult for me sometimes. The reason is because I have had to work really hard not to be a fixer but to step back and sit in the moment and just listen. There is much to be said about the power of presence and just sitting in the moment. This provides a chance for a person to minister in such a way where we don't even speak a word, but our presence speaks volumes.

As a young minister, I remember going on hospital visits with a senior pastor who was very concerned about time. It was not that he did not care, but that he was more concerned about the volume of people he could see instead of being invested into the moment. He told me that we had a maximum of 15 minutes that we had to spend visiting our members because we had to be back at the office by lunch. Of course, I didn't know any better, so I just assumed that that was how we were supposed to do visits. Quickly rush in...assess the situation... briefly speak, and then offer a prayer and head out to the next person. It was not until years later that I realized the damage that could do to my personal understanding of ministry and the mental health of our people that were in need of community and connection.

As we walk through our series Something to Say, I pray that we do not neglect the process of presence. There is power in allowing ourselves to just be in the moment with those that are in need and allowing them to know that they are not alone. Philip demonstrated the power of presence when he was willing to follow the instructions of the angel. At the right moment, Philip asked the right question and walked the Ethiopian into a full relationship with God through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Just like the situation I was in as a young minister being on a schedule for visits, I missed moments that could have had eternal ramifications. We have been called to sit in the moment with God and listen as He instructs us. We are called to listen and then go and share our story to others when they are ready to ask. Philip could have easily taken over the situation and may have missed the opportunity to build trust with the Ethiopian official. He waited for the moment in which God directed him, and the rest is an amazing story of eternal change.

This week we will be stepping into another time where God intentionally connects with a young man by the name of Samuel, a youth who had been given back to God to serve in the temple with Eli. Samuel's job was to stay and protect the Ark of God that was resting in the temple. Samuel was present, and God was ready to use him to begin a new faith journey that would eventually lead to the anointing of David, another youth, who would eventually slay giants and become king - the same David whose lineage is connected to the lineage of Jesus. Samuel spent his whole life serving God through listening and being present. God is waiting for us all to be a vessel in which lives can be changed. We all have Something to Say, but it begins with the realization that God created us with two ears and one mouth so that we can listen first and speak second.
