"For the Harvest to Be Reaped, The People Must Show Up"

One of the weirdest things that I have been a part of over the last 30 years of ministry is the attitude toward Celebration Sunday. Being a part of many different churches over the years, there are many realities that I have come to realize. First, Easter Sunday was ALWAYS the highest attended Sunday of the year. Second, many times the week AFTER Easter was the LOWEST attended Sunday of the year. Thirdly, people always used the excuse of the changing of time to miss a Sunday. Finally, Stewardship Sunday was ALWAYS the SECOND lowest attended Sunday of the year.

Why is it that way? In my personal life, I have never missed any of those Sundays. Yes, I know for 32 years I have been serving the Church, but I need you to understand that for the 18 years before that I did not miss those days as well. You see, the way that I look at it is God has called us to SHOW UP! When Jesus was teaching His disciples, there were many times where they questioned why they were doing what they were doing. One of the examples recorded in Matthew 14 was a day in which Jesus was teaching and the day was running long, and all of a sudden, the disciples became very concerned about the people. Actually, they were concerned about how they were going to feed all of these people who had come to "church." You know the story. The disciples told Jesus to send them home so that they could eat and then come back. Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." At this moment I was able to see something very interesting in the story. The people wanted to be there, and the disciples wanted them to leave.

Why is it important that they stayed and were there for what was about to happen next? Because Jesus did not want ANYONE to miss the miracle that was about to occur. You see, the world has gotten to a point where they want to direct the time and place where they believe Jesus should show up and show out. But Jesus quickly expounds on the fact that something is about to happen... a Harvest is coming. Yet the disciples who had seen Jesus do so much were not prepared for what was to come next. Why? Because they were focused more on their plans than the glory that was about to be revealed.

I invite you to join us this week and EVERY week to come and see how God is going to be revealed through the presence of His people. Jesus was able to feed well over 5,000 people with the small gift from one person who had five loaves and two fish. Through the faithfulness of the ONE, Jesus blessed it and multiplied not only enough to feed over 5,000, but had 12 basketfuls remaining. One for each disciple to behold. The HARVEST is coming, but before the blessing of the miracle will commence, God's people have to SHOW UP! We have to be willing to stop making the excuses of why we don't want to be there on a particular Sunday. We must realize that Jesus is ready to reveal something beyond what we can expect if we live out the steps that we have taught about over the last three weeks. First, EVERYONE Must Share the Burden. From a gift of fish and loaves, Jesus performed a miracle. It's the spirit in which the gift is given that makes the miracle possible. Secondly, Seeds MUST be Sown if we expect God to move in this place. We have to be willing to SHOW UP and allow God to equip us to be sowers. Thirdly, We WILL Reap what we have Sown. If we continue to give our least, we cannot expect God to bless us fully. We must play our roll in God's plan through our faithfulness to follow His lead. The Harvest is Coming... but please know that we need people who are willing to SHOW UP and help collect the gift that will be blessed and multiplied. Join us this Sunday in ALL services as we bring our offering in celebration for what God is going to do through Wynnton.
