"If We Have Breath... We Must Praise the Lord"

I have heard many people say to me that they have not been gifted with the ability to sing. In fact, many will tell me that they could not carry a tune in a bucket. All of this makes me laugh and shake my head. However, I think that we have truly missed the point when it comes to sharing our praise to God. We have equated the fact that we MUST be able to sing to praise God. When I am asked about that, I simply refer them back to my old school days and read Psalm 100 from the King James Version which says:

"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Know ye that the Lord he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name. For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations." Psalm 100

The King James Version of the Bible was the first Bible I was given, and I remember hearing Psalm 100 and realizing that we have been called to praise God. It is not that we have to do it through just our singing, but through any avenue we have to offer our gift of praise. The main part is that we need to Praise the Lord. A good example is seen in the last five chapters of Psalms because they are known as the Hallelujah Psalms. Why? For the mere reason that each of them begins with the phrase, "Praise the Lord." You see, we have been called to give the Lord our praise in any and all ways possible. In other words, if we woke up today and have the ability to celebrate life, we are called to praise the Lord.

So, as we close our series on *The Music in Me*, I hope and pray that we were all challenged to see the importance of our relationship with God. We were created to worship Him in everything that we do on a daily basis, even when it truly seems too difficult as we try to navigate through the storms of life. My honest hope is that we will realize that we are not just called to live an average, mundane life, checking the boxes along the way. We are called to step into this life with a passion that continues to direct our hearts toward our obedience to serve and praise the Lord.

As we come to celebrate this Sunday, I am excited about the fact that we are celebrating together as Church family. We will gather to break bread at 9:30 in the ministry center and will follow that with one service at 10:30 as we come and bring our breath to praise the Lord. I pray that we will all continue to see the goodness of God every day of our lives. I pray that we are constantly reminded that our lives are not our own but have been given in honor and glory to God. I pray that anyone who has the opportunity to step onto our campus will experience the presence of God in their life in such a way that they will also join us in giving praise to God.

Psalms 146-150 teach us that the first and most important thing that we are to do is *Praise the Lord*. As we continue to grow in our faith, I pray that everyone realizes that our lives truly exude our praise and every day is a new verse to a song that tells our story. We all have a praise song to sing to God. Some are still being prepared, but regardless of its completion, our song of praise will continue to be sung through every breath that we breathe.

Sunday will be a joyful celebration as we wind up our sermon series, "The Music in Me." This series, based on our Psalms, reminds us that the Church has worshipped in word and song, in faith and love, for centuries. The Psalms are our ancient hymns. They teach us to sing and pray using poetry set to music. This Sunday, our combined choirs will sing a beautiful anthem inspired by Psalm 139, "He Will Hold Me Fast." This anthem, derived from a hymn titled, "When I Fear My Faith Will Fail" by Ada R. Habershon, became popular in 2013 when it was adapted and set to music by Matt Merker. Ada Habershon was a 19th century missionary and hymn writing theologian. Her best-known hymn is "Will the Circle Be Unbroken," with music by Charles Gabriel.


